2009-2010 Scholarship and Awards Descriptions

The Alfred A. Volkmann Scholarship is presented to a graduating senior who has excelled in the study of history or political science and provided volunteer services to the school or to the Patchogue and Medford communities and who is interested in pursuing a career in law.

The Amy Jean Polimeni Memorial Scholarship is given in memory of Amy who was a dedicated teacher in the Patchogue-Medford School District for 32 years. The Memorial Scholarship is awarded to the graduate who is earnestly pursuing further education and career in Music for the Performing Arts.

(ONLY STUDENTS WHO ARE PURSUING FURTHER EDUCATION AND A CAREER IN MUSIC FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS SHOULD APPLY FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP.)

The Andrew "Sandy" Albano Memorial Scholarship is presented to a graduating senior in good academic standing who demonstrates dedication to their school and community by actively participating in sponsored organizations and/or community services.

The Anne King Swezey Scholarship in Theatre Arts is presented to a graduating senior who has demonstrated proficiency in theatre arts in school and/or community programs and intends to continue theatre study in college and/or professional school.

Applicants must submit a biography page detailing activities in music, drama, technical or allied aspects of theatre and future plans. Students should have an academic record of B+ or better.

The Arthur Fuccillo Family Scholarship is presented to an average student who has been actively involved in community and high school extra curricular activities.

The Barton Elementary School PTA Scholarships are given to graduating seniors who graduated from Barton Elementary School and who have been accepted at an accredited two- or four-year college, university, or trade school.

The Bay Avenue Elementary School PTA Scholarships are presented to graduating seniors who attended Bay Avenue Elementary School for at least three years. The students must have a good academic record, combined with community and school involvement and plan to attend college.

The Bay Elementary School Henry Hubbard Award is presented to a Bay Elementary alumni who is majoring in teaching or environmental science.

The Betty Gordon Blau, Class of 1922 Alumni Scholarship is presented to a graduating student with an 87.5 or better average who is involved in both school and community activities.

The Boddy Family Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a senior who is pursuing a two-year technical education program. Preference will be given to students pursuing a career in Fire Protection Technology, or Fire Investigation and children of firefighters and police officers.

The Brookhaven Great South Bay Lions Club Scholarships are awarded to seniors who are planning a post-high school education and who have demonstrated a high level of school and community service. The recipients must have maintained an overall average of 80 percent.

The Caithness Long Island Energy Center Scholarships are presented to four seniors who are pursuing engineering or environmental science. Caithness Long Island Energy Center is the pioneer in the development of clean, reliable energy.

The Canaan Elementary PTA Scholarships are awarded to graduating seniors who attended Canaan Elementary School. The students must demonstrate a high level of academic accomplishment and be cooperative, trustworthy, diligent, and responsible.

The Cheryl Kalish Cleveland Memorial Scholarship is presented to a senior who has attended Eagle Elementary School for at least three years. The senior must have been accepted at an accredited two- or four-year college or university and is planning to major in art or in a health-related course of study.

The Christopher John Peckham Scholarship is presented to a graduating senior pursuing the field of computers and who has maintained an average of no less than 85% in all courses taken in grades 9 - 12.

The Class of 1999 Tribute to Dr. Ferdinand Contino Scholarship is presented to a graduating student who has successfully completed at least one year in a foreign language, has demonstrated academic promise, extensive extra-curricular involvement, and a high level of citizenship.

The Class of 2001 Eric Stahlman-WTC Memorial Scholarship is presented to a high achieving senior who has demonstrated the qualities of leadership, benevolence, and trustworthiness, and who has served with distinction in the high school's service organizations.

The Class of 2003 Scholarship is presented to a graduating senior who exemplifies school and community spirit as well as academic achievement with an average of 85 or higher. The recipient has been active as a school or class leader or has been involved with leadership activities in service organizations or clubs.

The Class of 2009 Award is presented to a former Oregon Middle School student who plans to pursue a post-secondary education and has consistently demonstrated an exemplary work ethic during their four years at Patchogue-Medford High School.

The Corporate Raiders Internship Award, sponsored by Giordano's Collision Inc., is presented to a senior who has been in the club for two years and has successfully completed at least one internship. This student has demonstrated involvement in the many community functions in which the club participates.

The Dr. James Finnerty Scholarship is presented to a graduating senior who plans on pursuing post-secondary education and a career in the nursing field or medical technical field.

The Eagle Elementary School PTA Scholarships are awarded to seniors who attended Eagle Elementary School for at least two years, and who plan to attend an institution of higher learning.

The Eli Andrew Nathan Memorial Scholarship is presented to a graduating senior with an 85 average or better in the academic areas, and who plans to attend a four-year college or university, has participated in at least one interscholastic athletic program, and has earned at least one varsity letter.

The Elite Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation Dr. and Betty Fallot Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a senior who will be attending a two- or four-year college majoring in a health-related field.

The Elwood & Edith Shaber Memorial Scholarship is presented by the North Patchogue Volunteer Firemen's Benevolent Association, Inc. to a graduating senior whose parent serves the community of North Patchogue, Patchogue, or Medford as a volunteer fire fighter or emergency medical technician, and who is pursuing a post educational degree in the field of fire sciences or business administration at an accredited four-year college.

The Eugene Romeo Memorial Scholarship is presented to a graduating senior with an 85 overall average and intentions to major in music at a four-year college. In reverence to the spirit of Mr. Romeo, the student must be recognized as an active, generous participant in the music department who has performed at a NYSSMA level VI. Additional consideration will be given to students who have participated in athletics.

The Eugene Romeo Memorial String Players Award is presented to a graduating string player who has served both as a leader and example in the orchestra program and has participated in a wide variety of activities within the Music Department (including but not limited to: Pit Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra, Tri-M, etc.). The recipient will have shown the ability to play music for his or her instrument of the highest caliber.

The Frank Fren Scholarship For Patchogue-Medford School Sports is presented to a graduating senior who intends to pursue a post-secondary school education. The student must be pursuing a sports-related degree or planning to participate in intercollegiate athletics.

The Geoffrey Kutzing Memorial Scholarship is presented to a graduating senior planning to attend a four-year college to pursue a career in teaching.

The Gershow Recycling Environmental Conservation Scholarship is presented to a senior with a B or above average who demonstrates responsibility to the environment, job, school or community through work record, volunteer or civic activity. The recipient must be planning to attend a two- or four-year college, vocational school or other accredited institution of higher learning and plan to pursue a degree in either environmental science or engineering.

The Giordano's Collision Awards are presented to seniors with an 80 percent or above academic average who plan to attend college and major in the fine arts, and who were active as a cheerleader, a Raiderette dance team member, or in a musical or dramatic performing group.

The Harry J. Rose and Robert Rose Award is given to a graduating senior who has demonstrated achievement and potential in the field of fine arts and who intends to utilize this award toward further education in the art field.

The Howard Cohen Award is awarded by TEMPO to a graduating senior who has music as a major or a minor course of study. The recipient must have a B+ average or better in music, extracurricular participation in music activities for two or more years, as well as service to school and community.

The I.W. Bianchi - Gertrude Robinson (Class of 1922-Alumni) Bianchi Scholarships are presented to graduating seniors who have been accepted at an accredited four-year college or university, who have been active in school and community activities, and who have maintained a school average of 90 or better.

The James A. Alarcon Memorial Scholarship is presented by the St. Sylvester Knights of Columbus Council to a graduating senior who played in either the Sachem or Patchogue-Medford Youth Soccer Leagues, and also played high school soccer on the Patchogue-Medford teams. Student must be planning to attend an institution of higher learning.

The Janine Sucharski Memorial Scholarship is presented to a senior with an overall 80 average, but with an 85 average in music/art at Patchogue-Medford High School who is pursuing a four-year college degree in music or art.

The Jefferson PMHS Memorial Scholarship is presented in memory of Leroy Jefferson, a Patchogue-Medford High School Class of 1928 graduate and one of the few African American students in the district at the time, and Gene Jefferson, his son and parent of two Patchogue-Medford High School graduates. Both men spent their lives dedicated to a love of learning, civic involvement and concern for others and the recipient of this scholarship exemplifies all of these qualities.

The Jennifer Scharpeger McGlone and Dr. James McGlone Scholarship is given in memory of Jennifer and James who were 1989 graduates of Patchogue-Medford High School. Jennifer was a graduate of Plattsburgh State University and James was a graduate of East Carolina University. This scholarship is presented to a graduating senior with a B average who plans to attend a 4-year college and major in either business or education.

The Jesse Semeraro Class of 2000 Scholarships are presented to seniors who exemplify school and community spirit as well as academic achievement with an average of 80 or higher, who have been active as a school or class leader or have been involved with leadership activities in service organizations or clubs.

To apply for this scholarship, please attach an essay explaining what Family means to you and how has family values and morals impacted your life in a positive way to be the person you are today. In your future what would you like to contribute to society that will help the sense of well being in one's self and provide a positive force to all to believe compassion, kindness, and respect for others will be rewarded with these gifts in return?

The Jesus Garcia Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior who has served as a Youth Board member or Patchogue Medford Youth Council member for at least one year at Patchogue-Medford Youth and Community Services, Inc. within the past four years. The funds must be used for post-secondary education for an authorized training program.

The Joseph F. Russo Memorial Scholarship is presented to an honor student seeking a business degree or attending a technical school with an emphasis in business.

The Joseph L. Albertelli Memorial Scholarship is presented to a senior who attended Oregon Middle School and who maintained a "B+" or better average in science and/or is majoring in science in college.

The Joseph Lomicky Memorial Scholarship is given by the Patchogue Lion's Club to a senior planning post-high school education who has demonstrated a high level of school and community service. The recipient must have maintained at least an 80 average, and must be a member of the Leo Club.

The Kaitlyn Viola Memorial Scholarship is presented to a graduating senior who is planning on attending a post secondary school for beauty or planning on a future working with special education children.

The student receiving the scholarship should have the same attributes as Katie- someone with a warm smile and always willing to help someone in need.

The Lt. Michael Murphy, USN Seal, Medal of Honor Scholarship is given to a senior that displays exceptional leadership skills and inspire their peers in positive ways, as well as demonstrate a genuine dedication to their community.

The Lynne A. Krapf Friedman Memorial Award is presented in memory of Lynne A. Krapf who was an 1983 graduate of Patchogue-Medford High School. This award is given to a graduating student that actively participated in DECA, who exhibited strong leadership skills, has a minimum grade average of 85, and who will be pursuing a career in business or public service.

The Matthew Weisman Memorial Scholarship for Culinary Arts is presented by Bay Elementary School to a graduating senior who is pursuing a career in culinary arts/hotel management.

The Medford Avenue Elementary PTA Scholarships are given to seniors who have been students at Medford Elementary School for at least three years, and who are planning to go on to post-high school education.

The Medford-North Patchogue Lions' Club Scholarships are presented to members of the Leo Club who have participated in community service in keeping with the purpose of the international association of Lions' Clubs: "Service to Humanity".

One scholarship will be awarded to a deserving special needs student.

The Meghan Moffitt Scholarships are awarded to graduating seniors who will be pursuing a career in education. These students must not only achieve good grades, but should exemplify the example set by Meghan who was very involved in community service.

The Melissa Wayne-Dillon Memorial Award is presented to a female student athlete who has played either field hockey or lacrosse at the varsity level. This student must have maintained an 80% GPA and displayed leadership, sportsmanship and determination while attending Patchogue-Medford High School.

The Michael Curtin Memorial Soccer Scholarship is presented to senior girl who has played soccer for the Patchogue-Medford Youth Soccer League, played school soccer for Patchogue-Medford High School, has done some service work for the Patchogue-Medford Youth Soccer League (Coach/Train), and is planning a post-high school education.

The Michael E. Reilly Memorial Scholarship is presented to a senior who is a self starter and demonstrates a strong effort in the study of Electronics, Corporate Enterprise Networking (CISCO Systems), and Hardware/Software Troubleshooting. The latter two courses of study must incorporate elements in the study of Basic Electricity and/or Electronics.

The Michael John Campanile Scholarships are awarded to graduating seniors who have been members of the Varsity Soccer team, and are involved in a high school music performance group such as orchestra, band, chorus and any athletics.

The Mike Weiner Memorial Scholarship is given by the Greater Patchogue Historical Society to a senior raised in Patchogue who has outstanding community service. This should be a student who has participated in the high school athletic programs and plans to major in history in college. The student should have a "B" average or better.

The Navy (Seal) Lt. Michael P. Murphy Scholarship Awards are awarded in memory of Navy Seal Lt. Michael P. Murphy, a Patchogue-Medford High School graduate who was killed in action during a covert and classified operation along the Afghanistan - Pakistan border in June 2005. Lt. Murphy was posthumously awarded this nation's highest combat decoration, the Medal of Honor, for his courageous gallantry and leadership during a White House ceremony by President George W. Bush on October 22, 2007. The Navy (Seal) Lt. Michael P. Murphy scholarship is awarded to deserving students with a "C" or better average, who have been involved in any Patchogue-Medford or intramural sports program.

The North Patchogue Fire Department Scholarship is presented to a student whose parent is a member of the North Patchogue Fire Department or a member of NPFDF Explorer Post 517. The student must pursue education at an institution of higher learning.

The North Patchogue Volunteer Firemen's Benevolent Association, Inc. Scholarship is presented in memory of the deceased members of the North Patchogue Fire Department Benevolent Association to a student whose parent is a member of the North Patchogue Fire Department and who is planning to pursue education at an institution of higher learning.

The Oregon Fathers' Club Theatrical Arts Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior who has participated in an Oregon Middle School theatrical production and who has demonstrated good citizenship, strives for academic excellence and wishes to pursue further education in music, theatre, or related studies.

The Oregon Middle School PTA Scholarship is presented to the most well-rounded student who attended Oregon Middle School for all of their middle school years. Student must have an 80 or better grade point average and have some community service.

The P.Y.A.A. Baseball Scholarship is presented by the P.Y.A.A. Little League to a student who played in the league, who has played school baseball and who has done some type of service work for the league (i.e. training, coaching, officiating).

The P.Y.A.A. Softball Scholarship is presented by the P.Y.A.A. Little League to a student who played in the league, who has played school softball and who has done some type of service work for the league (i.e. training, coaching, officiating).

The Patchogue Garden Club Scholarship is presented to a student who will be attending a four-year college program and who has exhibited community involvement, and shows an interest in horticulture, landscape design, ecology, oceanography, the environment or a field in one of the above or of an area similar in nature.

The Patchogue Lioness & Lions' Club Scholarship is presented to a graduating senior who plans on pursuing post-secondary education. Students must be active in school activities, belong to a service club or involved in community service, and must have attended PMHS for three years and maintain an 85% average.

The Patchogue Lions' Club Past Presidents' Scholarship is presented to a senior who is a member of the Leo Club who will be pursuing post-high school education at either a four- or two-year college or university, and who has demonstrated leadership qualities, good citizenship, and has been active in community affairs or demonstrated a commitment to public service, either in the school community or the local community as a whole, or both.

The Patchogue Rotary Club Academic Scholarship is based on academic achievement (students must have a 90% average or above), service to the school and community, and demonstrated leadership. Special consideration will be given to students who are active in Interact. This scholarship is distributed over four years of college study.

The Patchogue Rotary Club Carroll M. Swezey Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior who has demonstrated excellence in English and writing and plans to pursue a liberal arts degree at a four-year college or university.

Financial need will be a consideration for this scholarship.

The Patchogue Rotary Club E. Earl Kaller Scholarship is awarded to a graduating student who is in the top 20 percent of the graduating class and who is pursuing post high school education to study for a career in business.

The Patchogue Rotary Club Nicole M. Cardello Scholarship is presented to a B student or better who is accepted to attend a college undergraduate program and has at least one extracurricular activity.

The Patchogue Rotary Club Robert A. Sheridan Scholarship is presented to a graduating senior who is in the top 20 percent of the graduating class and is intending to pursue a course of higher education. Evidence of significant service to both the school and community are required.

The Patchogue-Medford Administrators' Association Scholarship is awarded to a student selected by the high school administration who best exemplifies the qualities of leadership.

The Patchogue-Medford Alumni Association & Patchogue-Medford Alumni Association Edmond W. Tuton Scholarships are presented to seniors who attended Patchogue-Medford High School for four years and who plan on pursuing a post secondary education. Recipients must have an 87% average and be involved in school and community activities.

The Patchogue-Medford Congress of Teachers Scholarships are awarded to exemplary students who have at least one parent/guardian who is a member of NYSUT.

The Patchogue-Medford Directors' Association Award is presented to a graduating senior who will enroll in a college program leading to a degree in either the humanities or the sciences.

The Patchogue-Medford Friends of the Library Scholarships are presented to students who have maintained at least a B average, have shown outstanding community service in grades 10-12, and who will be using the scholarship for higher education. The applicant must be either a member of the Teen Friends of the Library, or they personally must be a member of the Friends of the Library, or a parent must be a member of the Friends of the Library.

The Patchogue-Medford High School Principal's/Pepsi Scholarships are presented to seniors who plan to pursue a post-secondary education and who have demonstrated dedication to their school and community.

The Patchogue-Medford High School PTSA Scholarships are awarded to seniors who have been members of the PTSA throughout their high school career, have attended at least four meetings per year, and participated in at least three activities per year. Students should have attended the high school for a minimum of three years and have maintained a passing average. Students must plan on a post high school education or plan to enter the military service. Scholarships will be awarded based on a point system.

The Patchogue-Medford Office Staff Association Scholarships are presented to students preparing for a business career in secretarial science, office procedures, data processing/computer technology or accounting. Academic/social/economic needs will be a part of the selection process. College or continuing education (business school, etc.) is a prerequisite.

The Patchogue-Medford PTA Council Scholarships are presented to seniors planning to continue education at any accredited two- or four-year college, university, trade school., or military. The students must have an 80+ average and be well-rounded.

The Penni Hartnett Memorial Award is presented to a senior who has been a Girl Scout for at least five years, belonged to Service Unit #49, and participated in community service. The recipient must be planning to attend a two- or four-year college.

The Peter Theodoropoulos Memorial Scholarship is presented to a student-athlete who has exemplified leadership in both the academic and athletic arenas, and outstanding service to the Patchogue-Medford community.

The Pilot Club of Patchogue Scholarship is granted to an outstanding member of the Patchogue-Medford Anchor Club who will be attending an institute of higher learning.

The Raymond F. Fell Scholarship for Volunteerism is presented to a senior who has demonstrated a commitment to volunteer for community service for at least 50 hours per year and will be attending a 4-year college or university.

The Regina Siepmann Memorial Art Award is presented to a senior who is continuing education in the field of art or an art-related field.

The Rita Ullo Leadership Award is presented to a Bay Alumnus who is a well-rounded student who is involved in community service, school sports or co-curricular activities. The recipient must demonstrate qualities of leadership, duty and pride and plan on attending college.

Only students who attended Bay Elementary School are encouraged to apply.

The River Elementary PTA Scholarships are presented to seniors who attended River Elementary School and intend to continue education after graduation. One scholarship will be awarded to a student graduating from the special education program. Preference will be given to former River Avenue students.

The Robert Lucas Memorial Scholarship is presented to a graduating senior in memory of Robert Lucas. The student must be a member of the band program, in an active leadership role, and plan to attend a two- or four-year secondary school. The student must demonstrate broad musical talent.

The Roland A. West Scholarships are presented to graduating seniors who will be enrolled as part-time students in post secondary collegiate or vocational programs for a minimum of ten hours per week while simultaneously working in a FICA covered position for a minimum of fifteen hours per week.

The Salvatore Nicosia Scholarship is awarded by Alumni Ms. Valerie Casey in honor of Mr. Nicosia. The scholarship criteria includes financial need, academic and curricular accomplishment and the student's demonstrated likelihood for success.

The Saxton Class of 2010 Scholarships are awarded to one former Saxton boy and one former Saxton girl who have consistently demonstrated an exemplary work ethic during their four years at Patchogue-Medford High School as determined by their teachers.

The Saxton Middle School PTA Scholarships are presented to students who attended Saxton Middle School and who will be pursuing a college education.

The Saxton Middle School Star Scholarships are presented to graduating seniors who are former Saxton students who participated in band, orchestra, chorus, or stage crew for four years. The students must demonstrate leadership, achievement and musical or theatre excellence and plan to attend a two- or four-year college

The South Ocean Middle School Music Booster Association (SOMBA) Awards are presented to high school seniors who attended and participated in the music program at South Ocean Middle School, continued participation in the music program at Patchogue-Medford High School, and plan to attend college.

If you apply for this award, you will be automatically be considered for the SOMBA scholarship as well.

The South Ocean Middle School Music Booster Association (SOMBA) Scholarship is presented to a high school senior who attended and participated in the music program at South Ocean Middle School, continued participation in the music program at Patchogue-Medford High School, and plans to attend college and major in music.

If you apply for this scholarship, you will automatically be considered for the SOMBA award as well.

The South Ocean Middle School PTA Scholarships are presented to graduating seniors who attended South Ocean Middle School. Students should possess excellence in one or more subjects and have volunteered 15 or more hours to an organization like the PTA and are members of the PTSA.

The Staff Sgt. Keith Bishop, Army Green Beret Scholarship is given to a senior that displays exceptional leadership skills and inspire their peers in positive ways, as well as demonstrate a genuine dedication to their community.

The TEMPO (The Enlightened Music Parents Organization) Band Award #1 is given to a band member of the senior class who has demonstrated leadership, achievement, and musical excellence. Music is a career choice for this student. The student must have a B+ or better in music, and have participated in music for three years.

The TEMPO (The Enlightened Music Parents Organization) Band Award #2 is given to a senior class member who has been in a music program during the sophomore, junior, and senior year in high school.

The TEMPO (The Enlightened Music Parents Organization) Chamber Orchestra Award is given to a senior class member who has been in a music program during the sophomore, junior, and senior year in high school.

The TEMPO (The Enlightened Music Parents Organization) Chorus Award #1 is given to a chorus member of the senior class who has demonstrated leadership, achievement, and musical excellence. Music is a career choice for this student. The student must have a B+ or better in music, and have participated in music for three years.

The TEMPO (The Enlightened Music Parents Organization) Chorus Award #2 is given to a senior class member who has been in a music program during the sophomore, junior, and senior year in high school.

The TEMPO (The Enlightened Music Parents Organization) Jazz Band Award is given to a senior class member who has been in a music program during the sophomore, junior, and senior year in high school.

The TEMPO (The Enlightened Music Parents Organization) Jazz Choir Award is given to a senior class member who has been in a music program during the sophomore, junior, and senior year in high school.

The TEMPO (The Enlightened Music Parents Organization) Jazz Ensemble Award is given to a senior class member who has been in a music program during the sophomore, junior, and senior year in high school.

The TEMPO (The Enlightened Music Parents Organization) Music Theory Award is given to a senior class member who has demonstrated dedication and participation in music for three years.

The TEMPO (The Enlightened Music Parents Organization) Orchestra Award #1 is given to a orchestra member of the senior class who has demonstrated leadership, achievement, and musical excellence. Music is a career choice for this student. The student must have a B+ or better in music, and have participated in music for three years.

The TEMPO (The Enlightened Music Parents Organization) Orchestra Award #2 is given to a senior class member who has been in a music program during the sophomore, junior, and senior year in high school.
